














Have you lost employment of business during COVID?



Are you on/have you applied for unemployment?




Did the supplemental income deter you from working?




Did you lose employment and now have employment?



Did you receive loans for your business?




Which services have you needed during COVID-19?




Did you lose your employer-based health insurance?




Which preventative measures do you practice?



Have you been invited to gatherings of > 10 people? (rarely/often)




Have you kept your social gatherings to ten or less? (rarely/often)




Have you attended events in RC with > 10 people? (rarely/often)




How comfortable are you with site mitigation efforts?

How comfortable with eating outdoors? (not/very)




How comfortable with eating indoors? (not/very)




How comfortable with retail stores? (not/very)


Travel out of state/events




Have you traveled out of state?



Have you traveled out of state to events?




if you were out of state, did you practice 5 Commitments?
(never/always)




If you traveled, how to self-isolate or restrict interactions?




Have you been tested for COVID-19?



Do you think you had COVID-19 at earlier date?




Do you think you are immune if you got COVID-19?




Would you help the contact tracing team if they called?




Would you get a COVID-19 vaccine when offered?




Do you know anyone who has been hospitalized or died?



Have you had a flu shot in the past?




How effective was the flu shot? not at all/very effective




Second Home Owners Staying Longer




How long do you typically stay in your second home or rental?

Second Home Owners Staying bc lower risk

Different responses on why people are staying, but theme seems to be the lower risk

- “Great community and Covid-19 is well-managed”
- “Because authorities here were taking it seriously and implementing appropriate measures. It's also easier for us to isolate ourselves in Stagecoach than at home surrounded by neighbors.”
- “Arrived here about a month ago to be in a location where local leadership showed commitment to virus mitigation/containment via public masking and business protocols.
