Routt County Transition Parameters

1. **Trajectory of cases**
 - a. Considers sum of last 14 days
 - b. Includes change in cumulative incidence (# of new cases divided by county population; result is multiplied by 100,000)
 - c. Includes change in positive test rate (#positive tests/# tests conducted)
 - d. b and c above will be displayed on two separate graphs/charts
 - e. Three options: increase of >10/100,000 incidence or >5% increase in positive test rate ; no change; decrease of >10/100,000 incidence or >5% decrease in positive test rate
 - f. Weighting factor (x3)
2. **COVID-19 related deaths**
 - a. Considers last 14 days
 - b. Three options: >3, between 1–3, 0
 - c. Weighting factor (x1)
 - d. Question: should we remove Casey's Pond?
3. **COVID-19 Hospitalizations --- assumes <50% of maximum utilization; >50% utilization automatically red**
 - a. Snapshot in time (count people who are residents of RC)
 - b. Three options: >5, between 2-5, <2
 - c. Weighting factor (x2)
4. **Community Testing and analysis --- assumes less than 48 hrs; more than 48 hours is automatically red**
 - a. Snapshot in time
 - b. Three options: staffing and testing supplies to support <100 / week, between 100-300 / week, >300 / week
 - c. Weighting factor (x2)
5. **Contract Tracing and issuing quarantine or isolation orders**
 - a. Snapshot in time
 - b. Two options: complete contract tracing and issue quarantine or isolation orders within 24 hours or >24 hours
 - c. Weighting factor (x2)
6. **PPE Supplies (for first responders, healthcare workers, and community test sites)**
 - a. Snapshot in time
 - b. Three options: Weeks of supply per current burn rate --- < 2 week, between 2 and 4 weeks, and >4 weeks
 - c. Weighting factor (x1)
7. **Economic impact --- loss in tax revenues (county and municipality)**
 - a. Forecast
 - b. Three options: > 10%, between 5%-10%, and <5%
 - c. Weighting factor (x1)
8. **Economic factor --- unemployment**
 - a. Snapshot/Forecast
 - b. Unemployment Insurance applications vs. rate
 - c. Three options: >10%, between 5%-10%, < 5%

- d. Weighting factor (x1)
- 9. Requests for DHS services --- need to identify those programs related to financial security, mental wellness, and family support**
 - a. Weekly average
 - b. Three options: >20% increase from pre-existing levels, 10%-20% increase from pre-existing levels, <10% increase from pre-existing levels
 - c. Weighting factor (x1)
- 10. 9-1-1 data for domestic violence, substance abuse, suicide, mental health**
 - a. Weekly average
 - b. How is it different from same time period in other years? Patterns?
 - c. TBD
 - d. Weighting factor (x1)
- 11. Additional qualitative measures (yes/no – 1/0)**
 - a. Adherence to mitigation protocols and personal protective measures
 - i. Use of face masks by public
 - ii. Maintenance of 6 feet separation/physical distancing (Unicast data/rating)
 - iii. Limiting group size < 5 or less (or < 10, depending on stage)
 - iv. Businesses adhering to mitigation protocols
- 12. National statistics for opening of short-term rentals --- national trajectory of cases**
 - a. National and Colorado

Additional long-term considerations:

1. Availability of local testing and immediate testing feedback
2. Availability of effective treatment
3. Availability of meaningful antibody testing
4. Availability of vaccine
