

A, F, & I. PETERS HOUSE 316 Seventh Street, Steamboat Springs

The Peters House embodies the characteristics of the Craftsman style of architecture popular in the Steamboat Springs area from 1910 to the 1920s. Craftsman bungalows were inspired by the Greene brothers of California who, in 1903, began designing and selling plans and kits for the simple to elaborate structures to be constructed across the country. The Peters House, constructed in 1928, has a simplicity of design, a hipped roof with overhanging eaves and exposed rafter tails, and smooth, Tuscan porch columns, and incorporates natural materials. It is located on a street lined with bungalows of the same style and era. Delano Scott, a former President of the Routt County National Bank and other regional organizations was a past owner of the house as was George Sauer, an educator for 46 years and one-time school superintendent whose wife taught school in Steamboat Springs for 33 years.
